The Real Estate Portfolio in the MBA program emphasizes a multi-disciplinary, integrated approach to the study of real estate. The integrated process of preparing real estate students for careers in real estate will include: analysis of real estate opportunities from a development perspective; exploration of the link between real estate and the capital markets through examination of financial institutions and instruments used to finance real property; structuring the debt and equity portions of real estate acquisitions; estimating real property value; understanding the laws governing the practice of real estate; and development of skills in real estate decision-making whereby teams design, complete, and present real estate projects in a competition forum. For interested students, the program offers an overview of issues dealing with sustainable real estate.

The multi-disciplinary focus of the program takes place both within and outside the Leeds School of Business. In addition to core courses stressing key functional areas of business, students can choose from a variety of electives offered within the School. Non-business electives outside the School are available and real estate students are encouraged to take one or more real estate-related courses available in the College of Architecture and Planning and the Construction Management program within the College of Engineering and Applied Science.

The Leeds School of Business, in partnership with the College of Engineering & Applied Science, recently launched the Dan and Laurie Ivanoff MBA track in Real Estate Development Management. This track gives students the opportunity to take three elective courses in the Department of Civil, Environmental, and Architectural Engineering in addition to the Real Estate electives offered in the Leeds School. This program of study prepares students for jobs in real estate development management.

Real Estate Finance

This portfolio of courses will give you the tools to effectively evaluate, manage and recognize opportunities in real estate from a financial perspective. Opportunities exist within real estate development firms, financial institutions, real estate investment trusts (REITs), mutual fund companies, hedge funds, consulting firms and financial analysis positions within non-real estate companies who have real estate.
