
## Why was I chosen for the Leeds EXCEL Scholars Program?



The Leeds School of Business has become much more competitive in its admissions requirements, with an acceptance rate just below 30%. Students admitted directly into Leeds on average have a cumulative high school GPA of 3.87.

The Office of Diversity Affairs and the Leeds School of Business are aware that many talented students fall short of the admission requirements. We recognize that these students are resilient in overcoming challenges, have a strong work ethic and leadership qualities, and understand the value of diversity. All of which cannot be measured by statistical numbers. Thus, the Office of Diversity Affairs conducts a secondary review of applications and has selected you to interview for a spot within our Leeds EXCEL Scholars Program. EXCEL stands for Excellence in Education and Leadership. As stated in your admittance letter, by interviewing for and being accepted by the Leeds EXCEL Scholars Program, you have an opportunity to gain admission into the Leeds School of Business.

If you are accepted into the Leeds EXCEL Scholars Program, you will enjoy the benefits of the program including admissions to Leeds, Leeds Residential Academic Program (RAP) priority, a one-time \$1,000 CU-LEAD scholarship, automatic enrollment into the Diverse Scholars Program, and connection to Leeds faculty and staff.



The Leeds EXCEL Scholars Program provides academic support to ensure your success as a first-year student in Leeds. Because your future GPA as a business student is critical to your future job applications, opportunities, and placement, we require all EXCEL Scholars to participate in the KeyBank Summer Bridge Program.

The Leeds EXCEL Scholars Program also requires students to participate in cohort courses for their first year. Cohort means that all EXCEL Scholars will be enrolled in the same class sections so that students can form study groups and access tutoring while also creating community. We identify the best professors across Leeds departments to support our scholars.

The EXCEL Scholars Program requires mandatory tutoring for students who earn less than a C on their first midterm exams. We encourage all students to utilize our FREE tutoring, even for those earning Bs or above. In addition, you will be required to participate in:

- Academic success sessions (faculty office hours, exam review sessions, academic skills workshops)
- Beginning and mid-semester check-ins with ODA staff
- Peer Mentoring Program
- Faculty Mentoring Program
- Professional development sessions
- Community building events

#### Why is the KeyBank Summer Bridge Required?

The KeyBank Summer Bridge Program is vital in assisting EXCEL Scholars in laying a strong academic foundation before starting the fall semester.

During the KeyBank Summer Bridge Program, you will have an in-depth introduction to your first-semester business courses, cultivate relationships with Leeds faculty and staff, and network with corporate partners during class workshops and corporate site visits. Summer Bridge courses and evening activities are also supported by current Leeds students, many of whom are past EXCEL Scholars. They are another group to support your successful transition to the Leeds School of Business.

The KeyBank Summer Bridge Program is a 3-week residential program on the CU Boulder campus. It is a free program (room, meals, and class materials are provided) but transportation to and from the summer program is not included. You must agree to fully participate and commit to the KeyBank Summer Bridge Program to be considered for the Leeds EXCEL Scholars Program.

The ODA is an undergraduate program in the Leeds School of Business that serves a diverse student body that is committed to being a part of our community.





# **Business Majors**



At the Leeds School of Business, students earn a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration with a declared emphasis in one of the following six areas: Accounting, Finance, Business Analytics, Management and Entrepreneurship, Marketing, and Real Estate.

Leeds also offers 20+ specialized tracks and certificate programs where our students can further define their degree at Leeds.

Many of our students choose to have dual emphasis or pursue more than one track. Students who select two areas of emphasis with specialized tracks can still graduate within four years. Each
