Students take city bus to designated hubs.




Arapahoe Ridge shuttles students from city bus hub.

Private-public partnership between RTD and BVSD.


 Hubs selected for easy access via popular bus routes like JUMP, DASH, 158, and Flatiron Flyer


Free Student Bus Passes (estimated cost of \$0-5000 /year)




Social distance, masks, and sanitation requirements on school busses could require more than one bus per route.

Opportunities for Supporting Multimodal Transportation


Retrofit Arapahoe Rd outside the high school to prioritize and protect pedestrians.




Connect disconnected bike paths and corridors.


Redesign select local roads as pedestrian friendly bike ———corridors.

New Arapahoe Road (Section)




Bike Corridors





















The Outdoor Option
