

- Founded in 1096, the University of Oxford has seen 50 Nobel Laureates either work or study within its walls and many of today's world-class scientists have been inspired by an Oxford education
- Oxford University has 38 colleges
- The oldest colleges, University, Balliol and Merton, were founded in the 13th century
- Green Templeton College is the newest and was established in 2008
- The University provides excellent on-site facilities coupled with proven experience of hosting conferences with >200 delegates at the University



Transport and Accommodation



- Good transport links:
 - 60 minutes by car from London Heathrow airport
 - Excellent bus link Heathrow to Oxford, runs every half-hour
 - Excellent bus link Gatwick to Oxford, runs every hour
 - Regular train service from London to Oxford

- Accommodation:
 - Many accommodation options, from Oxford colleges, former gaols to well known hotels
 - Block booking in Oxford college recommended. Cost ~ £80 /90 Euro/105 USD per night inc. breakfast
