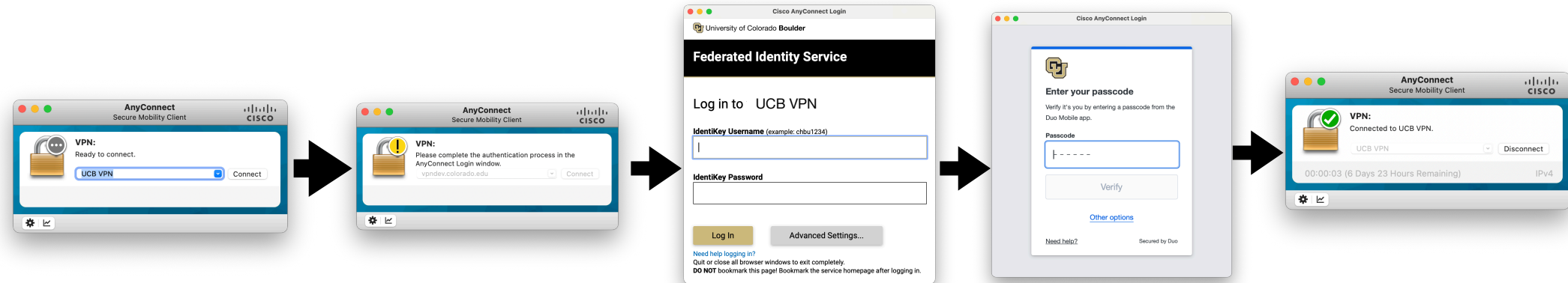
Your Cisco AnyConnect Experience for VPN Gets MFA

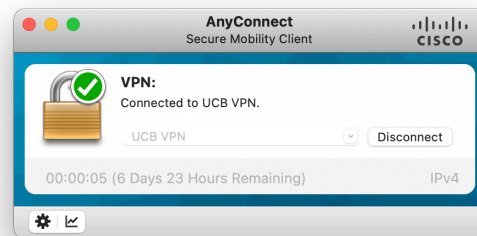

Anticipated Questions

Just to cover some basics



Why?

Better security.

VPN users have authorized remote access to the overall campus internal network. That's worth making sure that user accounts get extra protection.

How many people does this impact?

VPN usage is variable, so these numbers are approximate: but there are approximately 6200 unique VPN users per month

More than 99% of those users (based on an analysis in January) are already enrolled in CUB's Duo.

How often do I have to Duo Auth in a day?

The VPN connection with a Duo auth is separate from when you would log into a site that requires Duo on your native browser.

What should you expect on the day of?

Nothing.

Users with a valid VPN session will not be disconnected or prompted to Duo auth until their valid session expires and they attempt to reconnect.

This should have no impact to Always On users.

What does the comms plan look like?
