Your University of Colorado Boulder SHIP gender affirming benefits at a glance

Benefit	Notes
Inpatient surgery (in-network)	\$200 copayment per admission, plus 20% coinsurance after \$500 deductible is met
Outpatient services (in-network)	20% coinsurance after \$500 deductible is met
Outpatient behavioral health (in-network)	\$0 copayment
Inpatient surgery (out-of-network)	\$200 copayment per admission, plus 50% coinsurance after \$1,000 deductible is met
Outpatient services (out-of-network)	50% coinsurance after \$1,000 deductible is met
Outpatient behavioral health (out-of-network)	50% coinsurance after \$1,000 deductible is met

What is covered?

Some services are considered cosmetic and not covered by CU Boulder SHIP. Services that are considered medically necessary according to WPATH 8.0 include the following:

- Hormone therapy
- Genital and non-genital surgical procedures
- Blepharoplasty (eye and lid modification)
- Face/forehead and/or neck tightening
- Facial bone remodeling for facial feminization
- Genioplasty (chin width reduction)
- Rhytidectomy (cheek, chin, and neck)
- Cheek, chin and nose implants
- Lip lift/augmentation
- Mandibular angle augmentation/creation/reduction (jaw)
- Orbital recontouring
- Rhinoplasty (nose reshaping)
- Laser or electrolysis hair removal
- Breast/chest augmentation, reduction, construction
- Feminizing vaginoplasty,
- Masculinizing phalloplasty / scrotoplasty,
- Reduction thyrochondroplasty,
- Augmentation mammoplasty,
- Facial feminization procedures,
- Feminizing hormone therapy,
- Masculinizing hormone therapy,
- Puberty-suppressant,
- Breast reconstruction, if appropriate based on age of the Member
