- help with the administration of creating a base of Friends (donors) to the PJS
- help with the administrative end of expanding PJS advisory board
- help with the administrative end of having discussions with possible large donation individuals for the PJS

- Excellent experience for future employment (NGO's, charitable organizations, start-up companies, etc.)
- Making a lasting impact on the future of the Program in Jewish Studies at CU.
- Being involved with a new and exciting enterprise.
