Short bio of Roger Klein:

Friends and colleagues of Judge Roger A. Klein recently established a charitable fund to honor his long-time career.

Roger Klein was born and raised in Ohio, graduated from the Allegheny College in Pennsylvania in 1964, and then moved to Colorado to attend the University of Colorado Law School. After graduating from law school in 1967, he joined the Peace Corps. Roger worked as a public defender in Sterling and Greeley until the mid 1970s. He was the first public defender in Sterling and helped pave the way for the defender program. After leaving the Public Defender office, Roger actively engaged in the private practice of law in Greeley for approximately 20 years. His law partners included such notables as Andy Borg and Bryan Shaha. In 1994 Roger was appointed to the Weld County District Court bench where he served with distinction. He later became not only the Chief Judge of the Weld County District Court but also the Judge of Water Court Division One until his retirement in 2008.

He and his wife, Emi, have two children, Anne and Christopher. Roger has a wide circle of friends and admirers. He has been an enthusiastic runner and participated in both the New York and Boston Marathons.
