Status and Vision for NASA

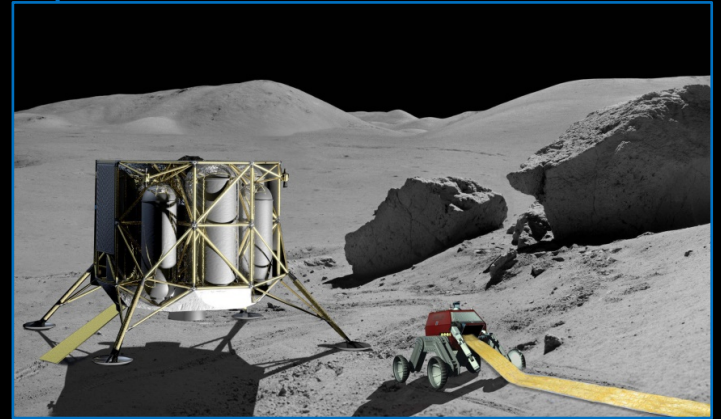
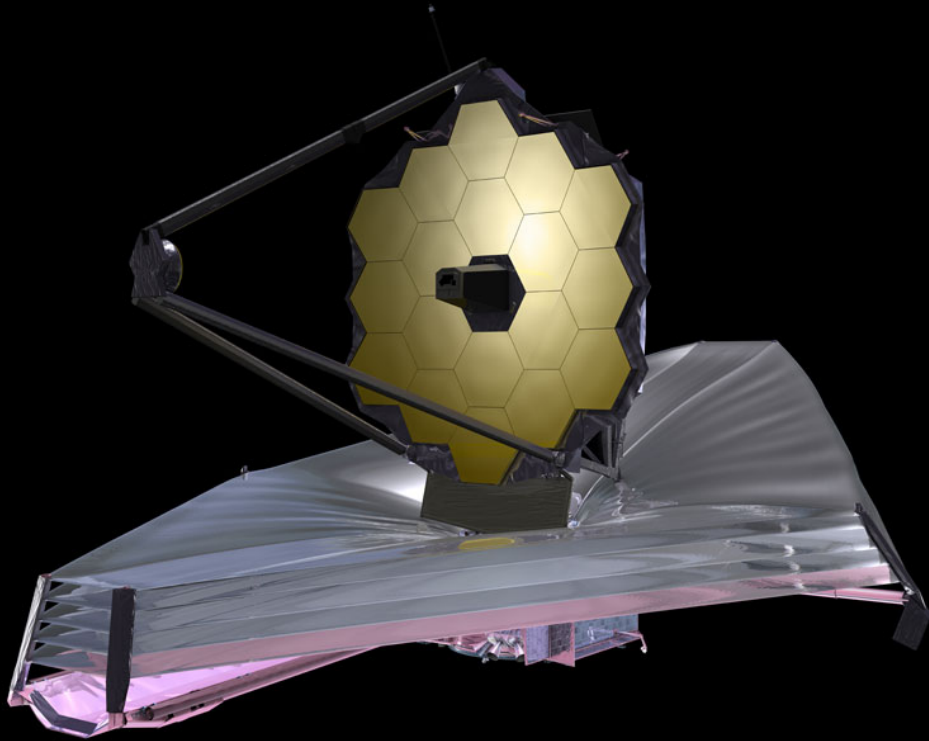
- **Status:** Although America's space program remains preeminent, NASA has suffered from significant under-investment over the past 2-3 decades.

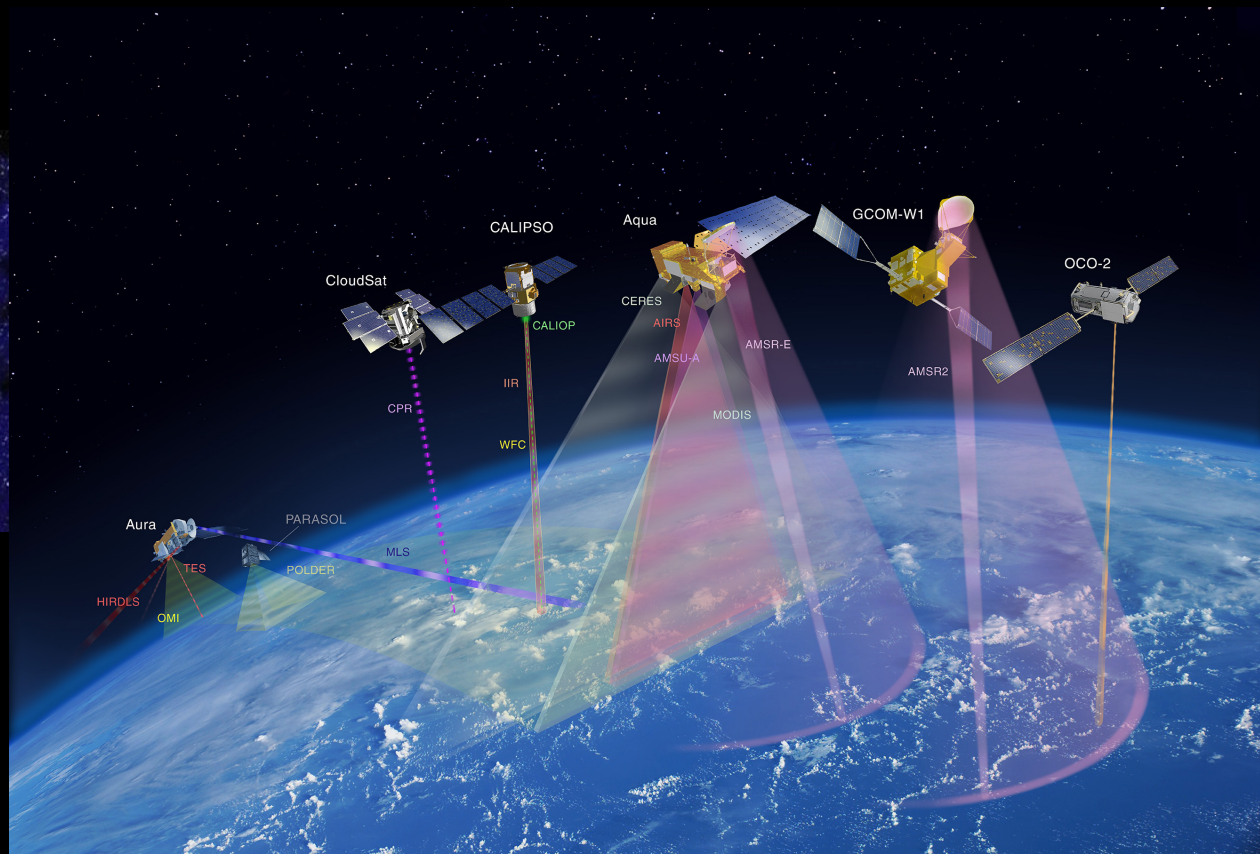
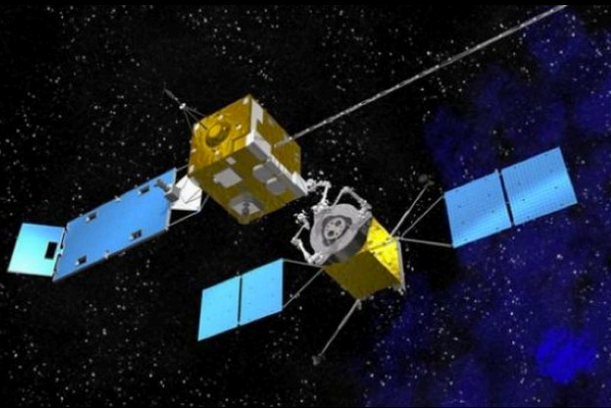
Development of Economic Resources

Support Broad U.S. Policies

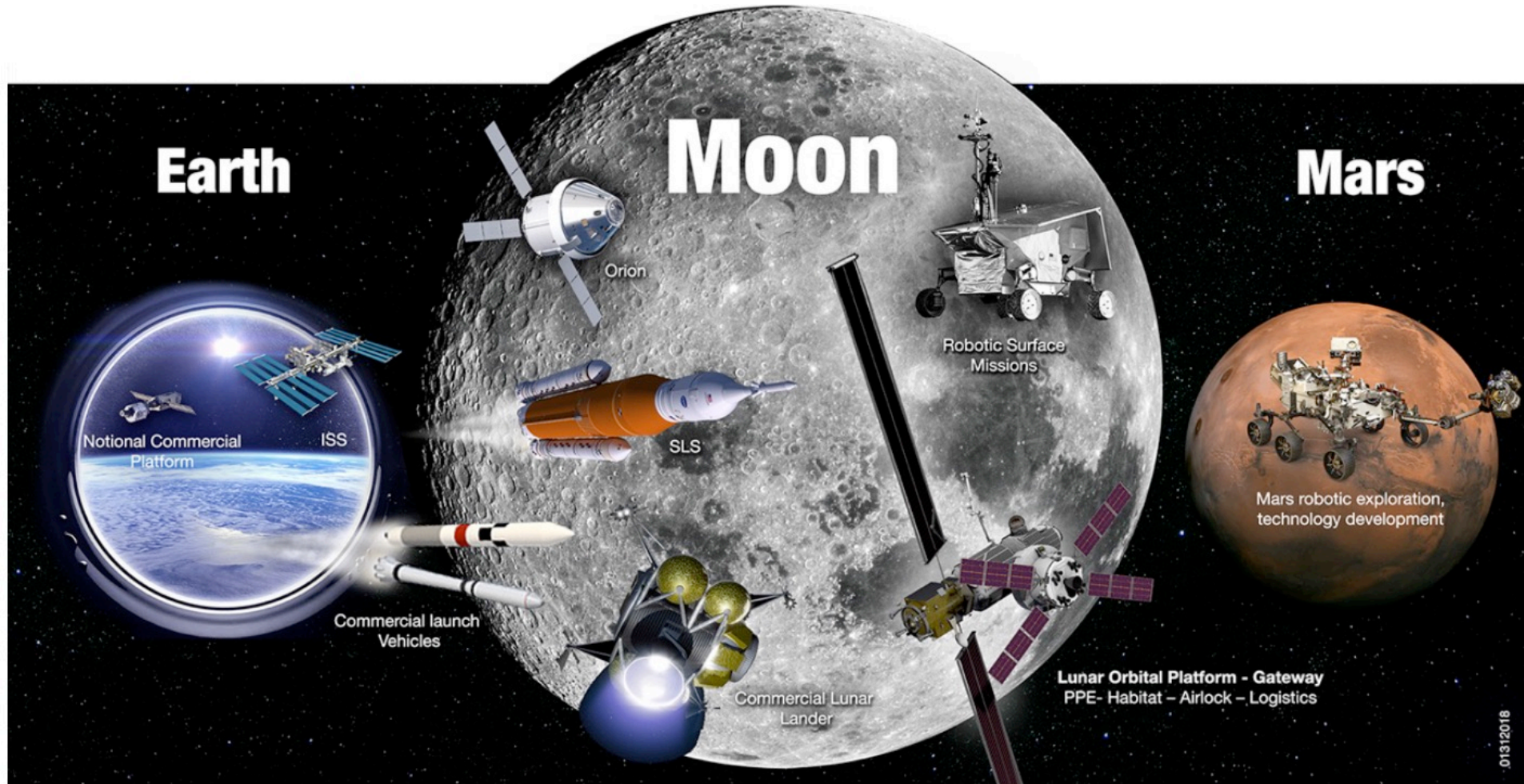

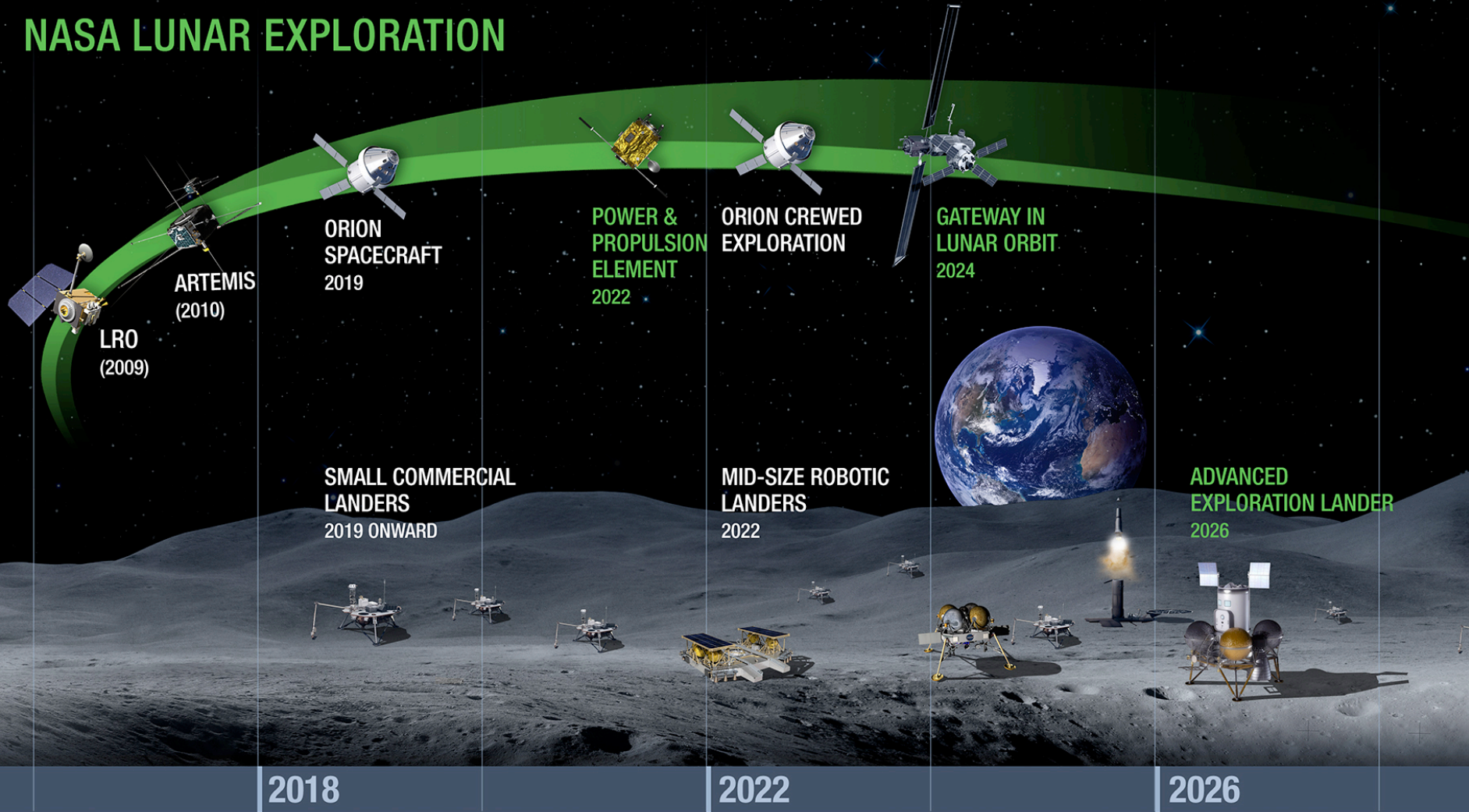
