It has been my pleasure to serve as president of the Alumni Board for the last year or so (pandemic time). The last year has made it possible for alums from afar to participate in events that, historically, have required them to be in the Boulder/Denver area. The Alumni Board has been a fabulous way to meet and get to know PLCers from other cohorts outside of my years at CU.

With the support of Emily and the Student Staff, the Class Champions have helped increase the number of alums aware of and attending events; we've gone from 420 contacts 18 months ago to more than 1,000 today! From Bert Carollo in the original class of '72, to Joe Pesce '84, David Davenport '93, Ashley Elmblad '03, and Kate Minnihan '14, active alumni and Class Champions from across generations have been key in increasing these numbers. As we quickly approach 50 years of PLC in the fall of 2022, we hope that everyone will have a chance to reconnect with the PLC community.

Last year, we launched the Think and Drink (T&D) virtual happy hour; every month, you can get together with PLC alums. It's a fabulous way to see people you've not seen in a while and engage with new PLCers. To quote Board of Advocates Chair Gretchen Bliss, "It is amazing how the years peel off and you are right back in recitation, discussing things important and impactful." The T&Ds have been an excellent way to spend an hour getting away from whatever your daily routine looks like. The topics have been wide ranging, from how COVID is affecting business, healthcare, government, and education to US/China - US/Russia relationships. We've had 464 T&D attendees over the course of the last year, with 145 unique PLCers joining. 

Alumni Spotlights

Nikhil Dandavati, PLC 2006

CEO Valve Systems, Inc.



Nikhil Dandavati, PLC 2006, is the CEO of the engineering firm, Valve Systems, Inc, his family's company. Throughout his time at CU and the years following, Nikhil has been an entrepreneur. He began with his business in undergrad, **Tuition Specialists**, that helped CU students apply for in-state tuition. In 2010, he started a non-profit called **Uncharted** focused on helping entrepreneurs developing their businesses and ideas.

Originally, Nikhil thought he wanted to go into venture capital, however later in life, he found himself at Valve Systems, taking over the family business. In his role as CEO, he is driven to promote sustainability in his business practices. Caring for the environment is a passion for Nikhil, who loves to spend time outdoors, especially seeing the world through trail running. Due to his brother's influence, Nikhil became an Ultramarathon runner. A huge focus of his life is fitness and he spends a lot of time training and running.

The biggest lesson Nikhil learned from PLC was how to cooperate. Collaboration with people to be effective in the workplace. It gave him a strong friendship foundation, and the ability to collaborate. He still serves on the PLC Advisory Board and loves to provide mentorship to current PLC students. Nikhil loves to focus on relationship building in all walks of life and treasures the bonds he formed in and from PLC.

Maureen Rikhof, PLC 1992

Director of International Relations at Otero Junior College



Maureen Johnson Rikhof is a member of PLC class of 1992. Rikhof ran for the Board of Regents in 1996. She attributes this to her time in PLC empowering her to think, "If they can do it, so can I." With the help of MANY PLC classmates, she ran a statewide campaign and won the election in 1996 with nearly 1 million votes statewide. For Rikhof, serving on the board or regents for 6 years was its own lesson in leadership - the opportunity to work with seasoned leaders, see people at their best and their worst, and watching the power dynamics in an institution the size of CU. Her work on the Board always came down to social justice. She remembers recitations about Rawlsian ideals - protecting those in our society who are the least equipped to change their own reality.

One of the most meaningful lectures she remembers from her time in PLC was Dr. Mom; Marianne Neifert. She had stressed the importance of building healthy personal relationships and support networks. Rikhof also remembers Don Johnson sharing with her class that sometimes it is enough as a listener to let someone know that you are empathizing and responding and a simple, "that really sucks," is enough sometimes. David Chrislip's visionary lectures were also inspiring and meaningful.

Rikhof's career has been in higher education - first at CU and now at a small junior college in rural Colorado. She has worked in the non-profit sector; all positions which worked to raise resources or lead organizations that empowered individuals living with a disability. She cares deeply about access and inclusion. Currently, she is bringing kids from other countries to my community in SE Colorado to pursue higher education goals. She appreciates the opportunity to work with dynamic young people who have already taken the biggest leap in their lives - living in a community they know nothing about to see where it launches their leadership journey.

Rikhof has five kids - the oldest, Henry, is a sophomore at CU Boulder; second oldest and my stepson are about to graduate high school and launch on their own journeys; and she has 14-year old twins! She just re-married in December of 2020 and have found a partner that I'd like to think Dr. Mom would appreciate. We enjoy outdoor adventuring, living in the small town of La Junta, dreaming about post-pandemic big adventures and cocktails.

a note from PLCers Travis Tortline (2018)



By partnering and volunteering with similarly minded organizations the club also hopes to engage others in supporting bee conservation, while club meetings aim to generate discussions about the way humans coexist with bees and the environment.

In its three year lifetime, the club has volunteered at events like the Honeybee Hootenanny and the Boulder Pollinator Festival, welcomed speakers such as local beekeeper Beth Conrey and CU Environmental Center Director Dave Newport, held arts and craft activities to help students create items such as beeswax sandwich wraps, and even sold local honey on the CU campus. With such great events, an active membership of 40+ members, and a focus on creating an inclusive community, it's no surprise that the club was deemed the Student Organization of the Year in 2020.

While the COVID pandemic has brought some activities to a halt, the club still continues to meet in a virtual format and is looking forward to a safe in-person return in the Fall of 2021.
