Unseeing and unhelped,

He sleeps behind a sheltering rock.

- 1. What does the oyster represent? The shell?
- 2. What does the poet mean by *boundless*?
- 3. What types of words are used in line 3 of the poem?
- 4. Why use an ellipsis to close stanza 1?
- 5. Why is the oyster not visible? Explain the connotations of "Unseeing and unhelped."
- 6. What is the tone in the last two lines of the excerpt?
- 7. What seems to be the message/theme of this poem?
